

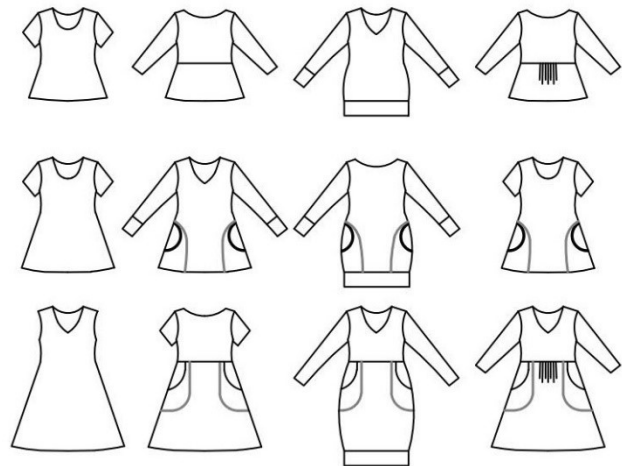

## sunday morning

eu size 32 - 60



This pattern has several varieties. It comes in three different lengths, with or without pockets. The lengths are top, tunic or dress. The sleeve can be made short, long with/without cuffs. The cleavage can be made round, v-shaped or with a boat neck. You can choose to part the front piece and/or the backpiece and then sew the skirt on to it, or to cut it out together with the skirt as one complete front piece or back piece. You can also choose to make a gathered skirt for more width.



Seam allowance is not included.



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# information

## **SALES LICENSE**

Included with the patterns is a sales license. That means that you as individual who sews as a hobby or owns a business have the right to use the patterns to sell clothes. The license applies only for the buyer of the pattern and the license terms cannot be transferred to a third party. Which means that you cannot let another physical or legal person produce clothes on a large scale on your behalf.

## **SEAM ALLOWANCE/HEM NOT INCLUDED**

You should add seam allowance on ALL patterns except where you intend to add binding or if the patterns says otherwise. I recommend that you read through the sewing instructions. Within it are instructions both in picture and text which will facilitate your sewing.

## **PAPER PATTERN**

The paper patterns are sensitive to moisture and tear. Handle with care. On certain paper patterns the parts are split due to lack of space. Read the instructions carefully to know if they are to be stenciled and put together in a certain way. When you sell your pattern, you must destroy all copies that you have made.

## **PDF-PATTERN**

Files are downloaded directly from your page on Etsy – after purchase they will be added to “purchases”. They are PDF-files and I recommend a pdf-reader with a setting to switch to “real size” and “automatic portrait/landscape” when printing. For example, Adobe Reader or PDF X-change. It is important to measure the control box so that it is exactly 30mm \* 30mm or your garment might not end up the way you imagine. PDF is easy to print. Utilize the layers to only print the page you want to sew and cut it directly. There are arrows on the pattern and they should align towards each other when you put the pattern together. There is also an overview of the pattern where you can see how the different pages should be positioned.

Because a PDF-pattern is a digital product there are no refunds or returns.

The PDF-Pattern may not be copied and/or sold/donated to a third party.

## **LICENSE**

When you purchase a pattern, you agree to an agreement with Sewingheartdesign that you accept the license with its terms and conditions. Violation of this agreement will be brought before the Swedish court.

# fabric requirement

The fabric requirement is calculated on a fabric that has been pre-washed and is at least 160 cm wide, including seam allowance (1 cm) and hemming (3 cm).

<b>LOOSE PARTS:</b>	ADD THE PARTS YOU WILL USE. Useful eg for different fabrics. e.g. Top 65cm + Bottom 100cm = 165cm
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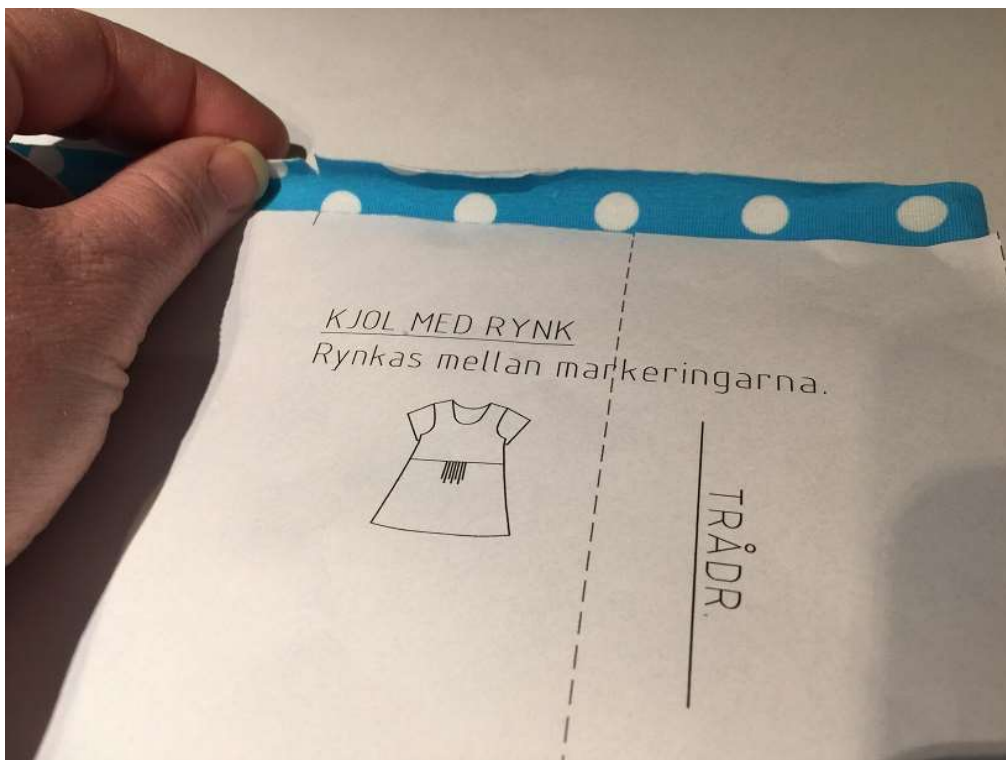
BODY LENGTH: 150/170/190 cm

Top, short sleeve	95	100	160 cm
Tunic, long sleeve	155	180	180 cm
Dress, long sleeve	220	220	220 cm
<b>LOOSE PARTS</b>	<u>32-40</u>	<u>42-48</u>	<u>50-60</u>
Upper part	40	45	50 cm
Lower part, top	30/35/40	30/35/35	50/60/70 cm
Lower part, tunic	40/45/50	80/85/90	70/80/90 cm
Lower part, knee length	120/130/140	115/125/135	110/120/130 cm
Sleeve, short	20	25	25 cm
Sleeve, long w cuffs	45/50/55	50/55/60	55/55/60 cm

Pockets wide	40 cm		

In this tutorial the front piece is cut into two pieces and the skirt is a gathered one.



Cut out all your pieces.



Gathered skirt: Make a mark both on the upper and bottom part where the gathering will start.





Pockets: Sew the binding onto the skirt to prepare for the pocket.



Pin or glue the pocket to the front piece. The pocket's right side should face the front piece's back side.



Stitch a decorative seam to sew the pocket onto the skirt.



Gathered front skirt: Pin from the outer edges and towards the mark that shows where to start the gathering. Pin tightly.

Sew the upper and lower pieces together if you have made the front/backpiece separate from the skirt piece.



Hemming the neckline: Stitch the shoulder seams together.

Neckline with binding: Stitch together one shoulder front/back and then bind the neckline.



Sew the sleeves on to the top parts.





Hemming the neckline: Sew together the side seams.

Binding the neckline: Sew the other shoulder seam. Sew together the side seams.



Rib at the bottom of the tunic/dress: Sew the sides together.





Fold the rib in half and sew onto the tunic/dress's lower edge.



Fold the sleeve-rib according to the grainline and sew the sides together. Fold it in half and tuck it into the sleeve, right side to right side. Sew it onto the sleeve.



Hemming: Hem the neckline, sleeves and bottom of the top/tunic/dress.

Binding: Finish of all the binding by stitching a straight seam onto the end of one side of the binding, then fold the other side over and sew a straight seam over it again. Cut off any excess binding.
